The First 1000 Days is one of the immediate priorities for Cwm Taf Public Services Board's <u>Well-being Plan</u>.

This event will bring together a wide range of stakeholders who will develop a shared understanding of the issues surrounding this period of life, including the prevention of adverse childhood experiences (ACEs). The event is an opportunity to explore such questions as:

- Are we doing enough of the right things at the right time to get the best outcomes?
- Are we making the most of opportunities to help parents achieve what is best for their children?
- Can we work better across service boundaries and in sharing information at the earliest possible opportunity, if we have concerns?
- Are we identifying and responding early enough to risks before they become established problems?
