What are research studies?

Research studies are carried out to answer specific questions on how to prevent, diagnose, or treat diseases or disorders. There are many different types of research study. For instance, clinical trials are used to test new medicines or devices. Other studies might use only interviews or questionnaires to study people's behaviour in relation to health.

The GIRASOL Study

A research team, at the School of Medicine of Cardiff University, aims to find out how results from health research studies should be made available to study participants.

The information collected will be used to ensure that, in the future, study participants can more easily access health research findings relevant to them.
